Ocala, Fla.—The Florida Department of Health in Marion County is highlighting the importance of breastfeeding during National Breastfeeding Month. Breastfeeding plays a critical role in healthy development from the very beginning of a child's life.

"Healthy babies are the future of Marion County, and breastfeeding is by far the healthiest option for them," said Florida Department of Health in Marion County Health Officer Erin Hess. "We want to support breastfeeding moms and help local businesses become more breastfeeding-friendly."

Earlier this year, the department launched the Florida Healthy Babies initiative and has invested nearly two million dollars in helping hospitals around the state promote "Baby Steps to Baby Friendly" in order to support mothers in practicing exclusive breastfeeding for their infants. Breast milk contains antibodies that help protect infants from common childhood illnesses.

As part of the department's Florida Health Babies efforts in Marion county, health department staff held a community meeting at the College of Central Florida in June to discuss the challenges Marion County mothers face, and possible steps to help meet those challenges.

To reach the goal of exclusive breastfeeding for at least six months, mothers need supportive maternity leave policies, flexible work hours, infant and child-care at or near the workplace, and private facilities for expressing and storing breastmilk. It takes time and practice to learn how to breastfeed, both for mother and baby, and to establish a good milk supply.
